Diploma Requirements

- Alberta Education specifies courses needed to complete a high school diploma
- Some employers require a diploma as a condition of hiring
- Fox Creek School offers the core academic courses, arts and Career Technology Studies courses necessary to earn a high school diploma

Alberta High School Diploma Requirements

100 Credits

- English Language Arts - 30 Level
(ELA 30-1 or 30-2)
- Social Studies - 30 Level
(Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2)

- Mathematics - 20 Level
(Math 20-1 or Math 20-2 or Math 20-3)
- Science - 20 Level
Science 24 or Science 20 or Biology 20 or
Chemistry 20
Or Physics 20
- Physical Education 10 (3 credits)
- Career And Life Management (3 credits)

- 10 credits
- Career and Technology Studies (CTS)
- Fine Arts
- Second Languages
- Physical Education 20 and / or 30
- Knowledge and Employability Courses
- Registered Apprenticeship Program Courses

Tips For Academic Success

- A positive attitude
- A willingness to do your best in all classes
- A willingness to try different courses even those you may not be interested in
- Consistent attendance
- Keep up with assignments and due dates
- Meet the requirements of an Alberta High School Diploma
- Read/Review course related material everyday
- Ask for help if you are overwhelmed (teacher, counsellor, trusted adult)
- Cooperation and following school guidelines for behaviour standards
- Stay organized in your locker, binders and time

Stay Healthy

- Success at school requires good health
- Make healthy food choices
- Exercise and get fresh air
- Drink plenty of water
- Stay clear of the flu by frequent hand washing
- Sleep sleep sleep (but not in class)
- Set goals and achieve them - it's good to keep a positive attitude!!!
- Access support networks when struggling -CHAMP Team, Mental Health, and Teachers

Grade 10 Mandatory Courses

- English 10-1 or 10-2
- Math 10C or 10-3
- Science 10 or 14
- Social Studies 10-1 or 10-2
- CALM - Career & Life Management
- Physical Education 10 - at least 3 credits
- Option Courses

Option Courses

- CTS - Career & Technology Studies
 - Computer Science, Construction, Foods, Cosmetology, Digital Photography, Leadership, Media Arts, Mechanics, Recreational Leadership, Video Arts, Welding, and Wildlife

Other Changes for Grade 10



- 2 semesters
 - September to January - with final exams - last 4 days - will not be rescheduled
 - February to June with final exams - last 4 days - will not be rescheduled
- 4 periods per day each 80 minutes - two in the am and two in the pm and 15 minutes of Teacher Advisory Group
- The pacing is much faster

What is the difference between 10-1 and 10-2 courses?

- 10-1 courses are designed for students to get a high school diploma and attend university, college, or Registered Apprenticeship Program
- 10-2 courses are designed for students to get a high school diploma and attend a college, or Registered Apprenticeship Program (Applied Courses)
- Recommendation is a 65% or higher mark in grade 9 core subject areas for 10-1 courses
- A strong work ethic is required to be successful in 10-1 courses

Knowledge and Employability Courses

- K and E courses lead to a High School Completion Certificate, not a diploma
- K and E courses can help students who need to catch up on course content due to extensive absences from school
- It is possible to transition from K and E courses to diploma courses with hard work - the reward a diploma, not a certificate, and more post secondary choices

Here is why



Grade 9 to High School

- Grade 9 achievement determines high school course streams

LA 9 mark $> 65\%$ = English 10-1

LA 9 mark $< 65\%$ = English 10-2

Math 9 mark $> 65\%$ = Math 10 Common

Math 9 mark between $50\% - 65\%$???

Math 9 mark $< 50\%$ = Math 10-3

Grade 9 to High School

- Science 9 mark $>50\%$ = Science 10
- Science 9 mark $< 50\%$ = Science 14
- Social Studies 9 mark $> 60\%$ = Social Studies 10-1
- Social Studies 9 mark $< 60\%$ = Social Studies 10-2

Grade 9 to High School

- Grade 9 core academic marks $< 40\%$ = Knowledge and Employability
- Students who do not meet the academic prerequisite marks, who want to work hard and move into the academic courses, can still do so.
- They will most likely need four years of high school rather than three to earn a diploma.

Screening At Registration

- Each student registering in grade 10 will have their marks screened prior to course selection.
- Administration and counselling staff will work with students to determine the best course stream, to ensure students' success.
- Grade 9 achievement is crucial to course selection

Diploma Requirements

- Students earn “credits” for each course completed
- A minimum of 100 credits is required to earn a diploma.
- Successful completion of the following courses is mandatory:

Flexibility

- The requirements for a diploma are set by Alberta Education and not negotiable
- At Fox Creek School you can take courses in many formats. It is evident students have the most success in a classroom with a teacher and their peers.
- CTS courses this year include: Cosmetology, Basic Mechanics, Woods, PE Option and others as we move forward with timetable

Work Experience Program

- Mr. Thesen
- Approved work sites of all types are available in town
- Learn new skills, explore career possibilities, earn credits towards your diploma, and build your resume

Registered Apprenticeship Program

- Mr. Thesen
- You must be in Grade 11 and be hired as an Apprentice
- You can earn money, gain knowledge and skills specific to a trade, and get high school credits that can be applied towards your diploma.

How many credits are expected for each year of high school?

- Grade 10 - a minimum of 40 credits
- Grade 11 - a minimum of 40 credits
- Grade 12 - a minimum of 35 credits - only one spare will be allowed in grade 12 - if a course is below 50% in grade 10 or 11 a student must take a full course load of 40 credits in grade 12

Spares?

- Grade 10 - no spares allowed
- Grade 11 - no spares allowed
- Grade 12 - up to one spare - if no courses have been below 50% in grade 10 & 11

Tools to keep you informed

To ensure success for your child it is most important to stay connected. Ongoing communication with the teenager in your family is a music!
Making sure you encourage success at school will make a difference in the attitude of your child.

- Call and talk with the teacher

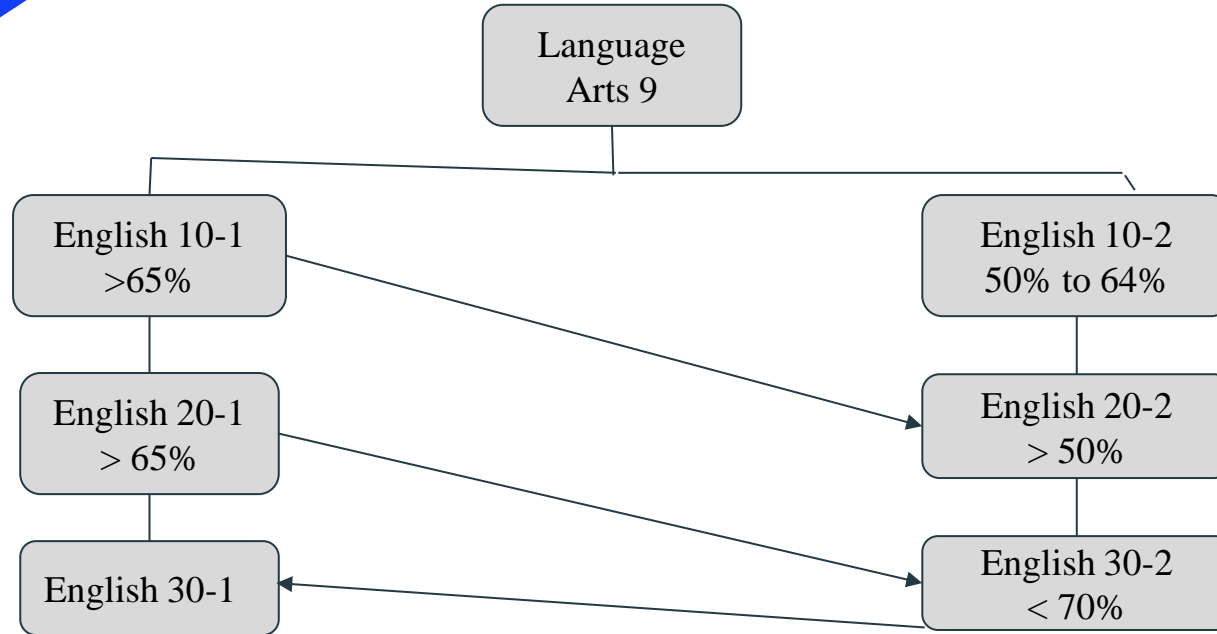
Other factors that impact success

 - Summer Boot Camps

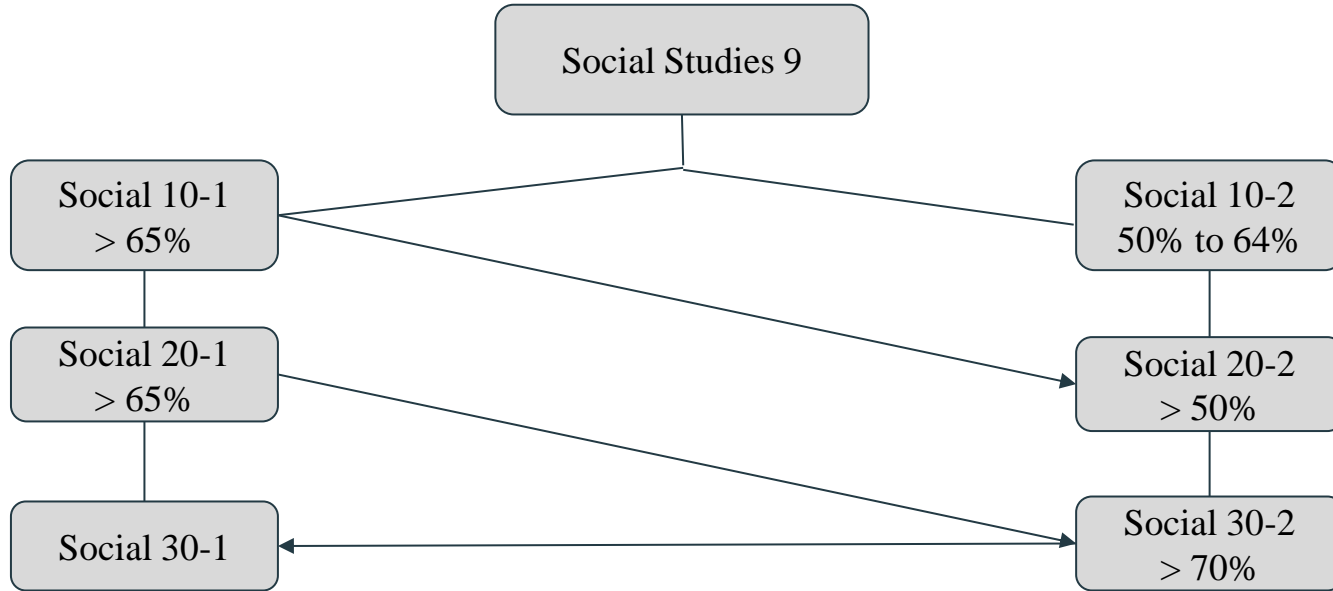
Other factors that impact success

 - Encourage positive priority setting and time management--your child will have a lot more to balance as their high school years continue

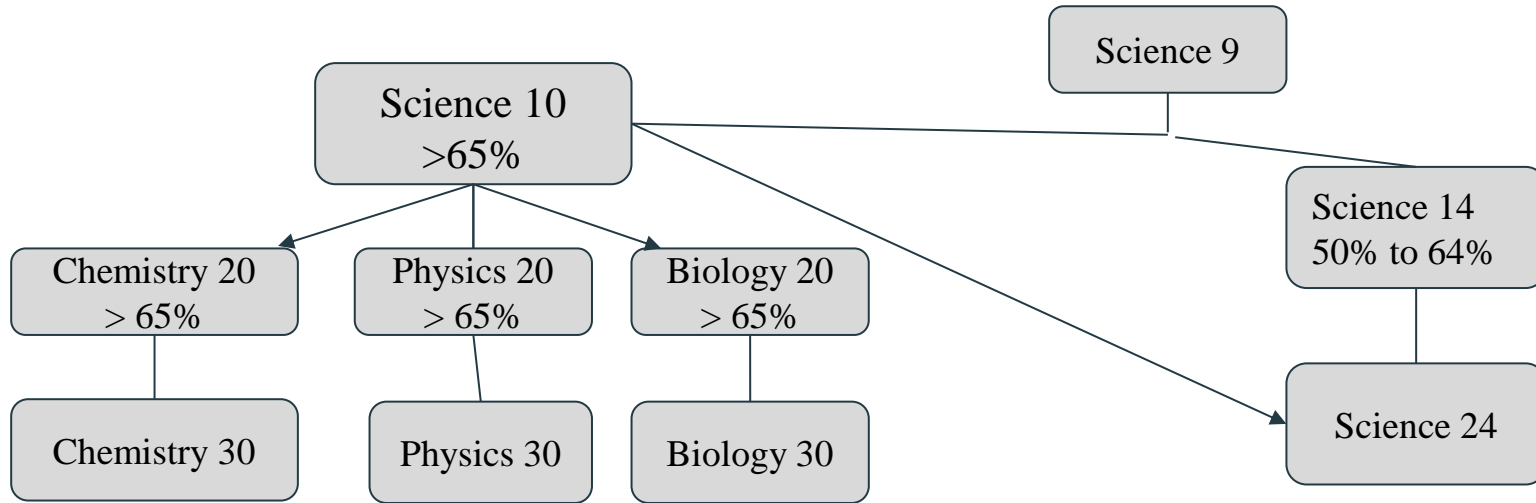

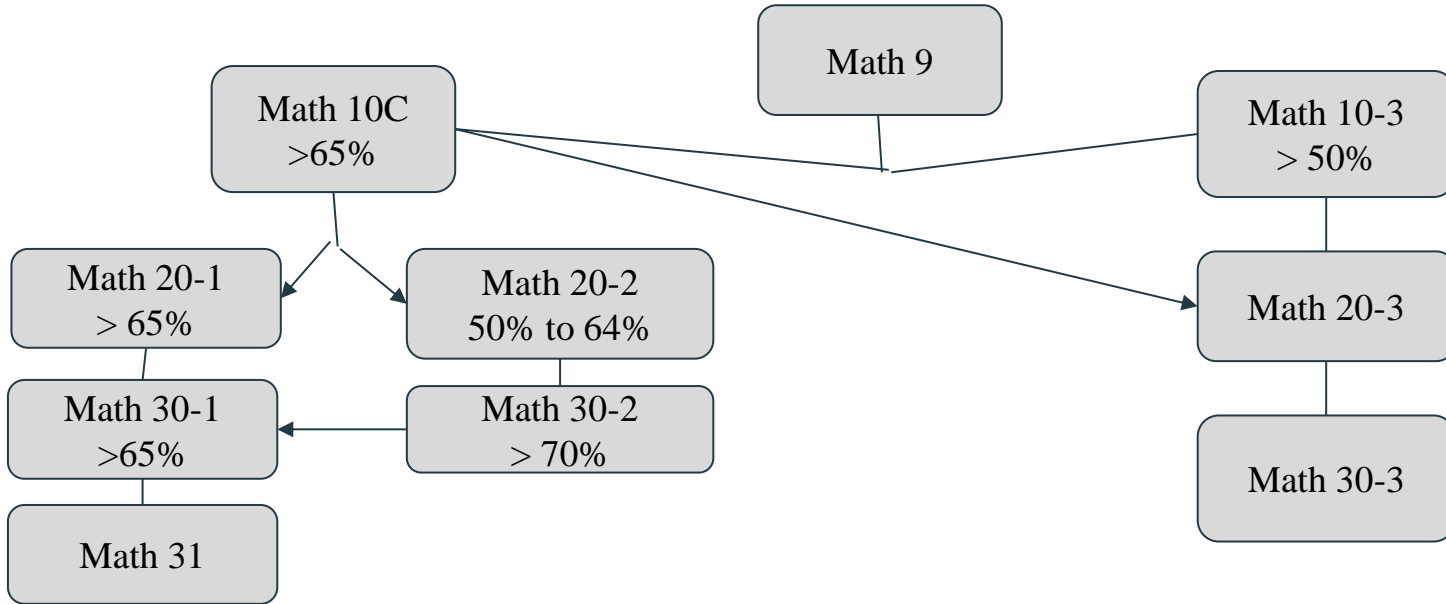
Senior High Social Studies

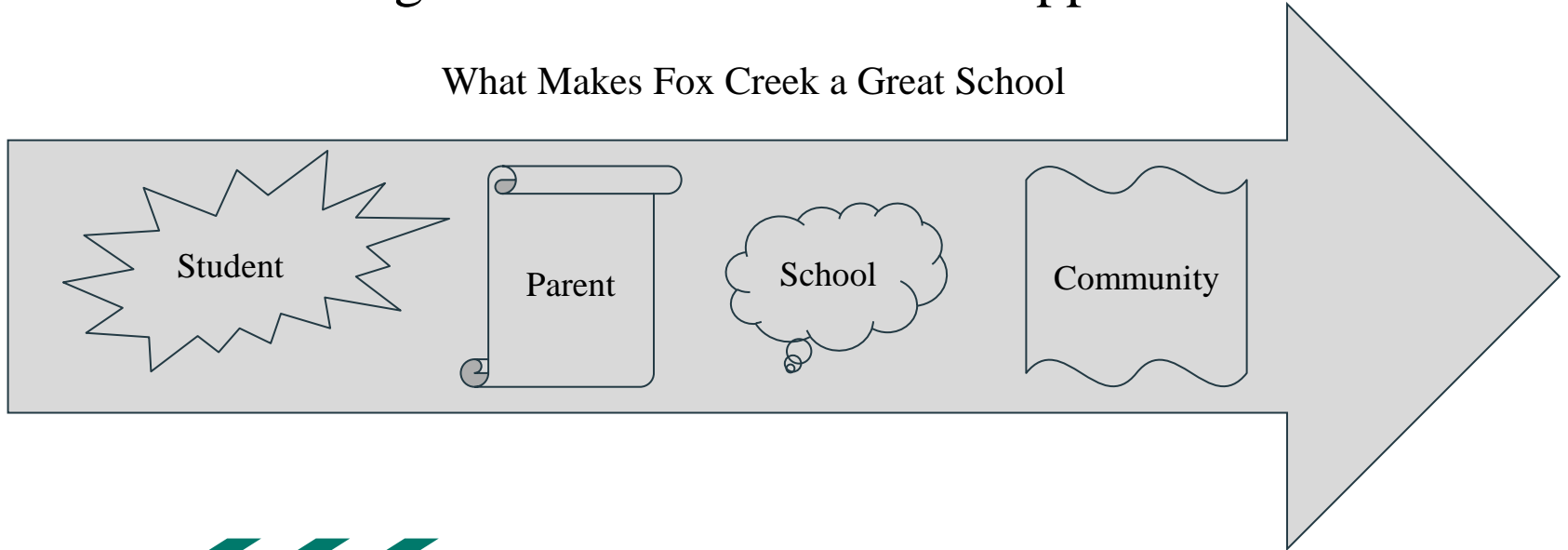
