




Fox Creek School students & parents:

WHO IS KIDSPORT?

We provide grants to help cover the costs of registration fees so that all kids aged 18 and under in Alberta can play a season of sport.

In partnership with ASAA, we are breaking down barriers to sport participation by helping low-income families pay for their children's high school sport registration fees.

WHO DO WE HELP?

Eligibility for funding is based solely on a family's household income. We use the Government of Canada's Low-Income Cut-Off Rates and add a 50% buffer to ensure any family that needs support, has access to it.

HOW TO APPLY

Head over to www.kidsport.ca/alberta to learn about (and start!) the application process.

If an application is submitted before a season is over, registration fees for sports currently in season can be applied for.
